

Phase 1: Memoryscapes: Dissonant Heritage in Podgórze's Public Space

June 2022 - April 2023



This Memoryscapes project seeks to provide a preliminary investigation of the tangible and intangible remnants of (dissonant) heritage through mapping physical art and heritage sites in Podgorze's district and by creating new entry points for reflection and ways of seeing and navigating the intersection of the past and present through the artistic intervention of memoryscapes.

How does seeing our physical landscape through a different lens facilitate new, alternative or forgotten stories and moments in time? And what implications does it provide for how we can shape the future?

As part of my initial mapping and artistic research, this project showcased below seeks to enter new territory, a different perspective, and reside in a liminal space where the past, present, and future intersect. The processes and outcomes of this preliminary investigations include taking a contemporary approach to the film above by recording my bicycle ride through the selected district, starting at the bottom of Kazimierz, going through Podgórze and ending at Kraków-Płaszów Concentration Camp and its surrounding areas. The film provides an abstracted timelapse of this route with selected images of specific portions of the journey from the film shown below.

With this portion of the project, my goal was to capture what is not and cannot be mapped -- the intersection of the physical landscape of natural and urban spaces with the intangiblity of memory and heritage i.e. what is preserved, memorialized, and revitalized versus what is abandoned, buried, surpressed, or forgotten. And finally, how art and artistic invention provides an entry point for investigating this liminal space as a safe space for reflection, active listening, and questioning.

What can these abstract compositions and memoryscapes tell us?

How can we respond?

Introducing #migratingmemoryscapes!

We are a transnational <u>#CDAF</u> grant project based in Poland through @ExchangeOurWorld and @VoicesOfExchange. This project seeks to support long-term community-building through art workshops that will facilitate cross-cultural dialogue between migrant and non-migrant communities in Poland.

This project is run by <u>#ExchangeAlumni</u> and alumni of @FulbrightPoland Joanna Pottle and Frankee Lyons and seeks to investigate how shared history and heritage is enmeshed within the contemporary lived experiences of migrants. Our aim is to analyze this within our local context of Kraków and Warsaw, both cities that have rapidly growing migrant populations consisting of refugees from Ukraine and Belarus as well as a rich multicultural community of people from all over the world.

These workshops, in Kraków and Warsaw, provide space for intergenerational community members to connect through personal stories and family histories of migration and displacement in cooperation with local organizations. Following prompt-based discussions, participants will produce visual and text based art, which will be curated and displayed – with accompanying historical context – in physical and online exhibits.
